Thanks In large part to the tens of thousands of people who worked with us to reach out to United States' Members of Congress, the Stop Invasive Species Act was signed into law over the summer. This law requires the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to develop a plan to separate the Great Lakes and Mississippi River systems -- the only permanent, long-term solution to stop the carp -- in an expedited timeframe. However, the job is far from done and other, less effective, options are being debated as the Asian carp continue to swim closer to our Great Lakes.

We need your help to continue building a growing chorus of support to ensure the U.S. Congress permanently stops Asian carp as fast as possible. As a Great Lakes-dweller, you can join our efforts to demonstrate basin-wide support.

Freshwater Future has teamed up with the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Cities Initiative to develop a resolution that communities can pass in support of permanently stopping Asian carp. We are looking to get support from communities throughout the basin, including those on both the American and Canadian side of the border. In engaging communities throughout the basin, we will be able to demonstrate to Congress the strong support for addressing this critical bi-national issue.

A list of communities that have passed resolutions will then be presented to Members of Congress as a demonstration of strong support for action in their districts, and around the region. We will also strive to gain media attention around each community that
