# TAKE ACTION: No Lead is Safe

Public comment is open on the U.S. EPA's proposed updates to the Lead and Copper Rule, which protects families by preventing and responding to lead in drinking water.



### Wins to Celebrate

- Full replacement of all lead and galvanized lines in 10 years
- Improved public transparency
- Stronger sampling requirements
- Boosted support for impacted communities

### But We Deserve Better Still

The proposed changes are a step in the right direction, but more can and should be done because no lead is safe. We recommend that the U.S. EPA:

- Require water utilities to cover all replacement costs
- Get rid of waivers or other exceptions based on water utility size that result in inequal protections, including
  - 10-year pipe replacement extensions
  - waiving pipe replacement, chemical treatment, and testing in very small communities
- Require sampling in all schools and child care facilities
- Require copper, or polypropylene when copper is not feasible, as new pipe materials due to common use of cheaper, toxic plastics
- Strengthen water systems' filter distribution requirements
